66. うち kōl.

The word $k\bar{o}l$ in one form or another corresponds variously to English "each, every, all, the whole." The uninflected form precedes the noun it modifies and may be joined with $maqq\bar{e}\bar{p}$ as $k\bar{o}l$ or stand independently as $k\bar{o}l$. The following examples represent typical usage. Note carefully the constructions translated with "each, every," as opposed to "all."
